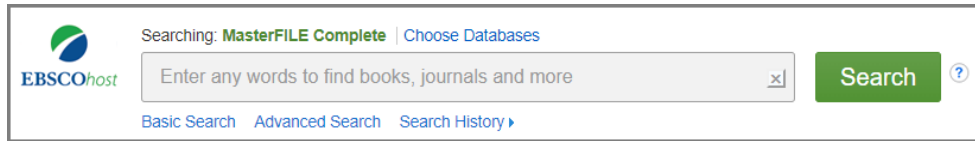


# Citing Sources in EBSCO Resources

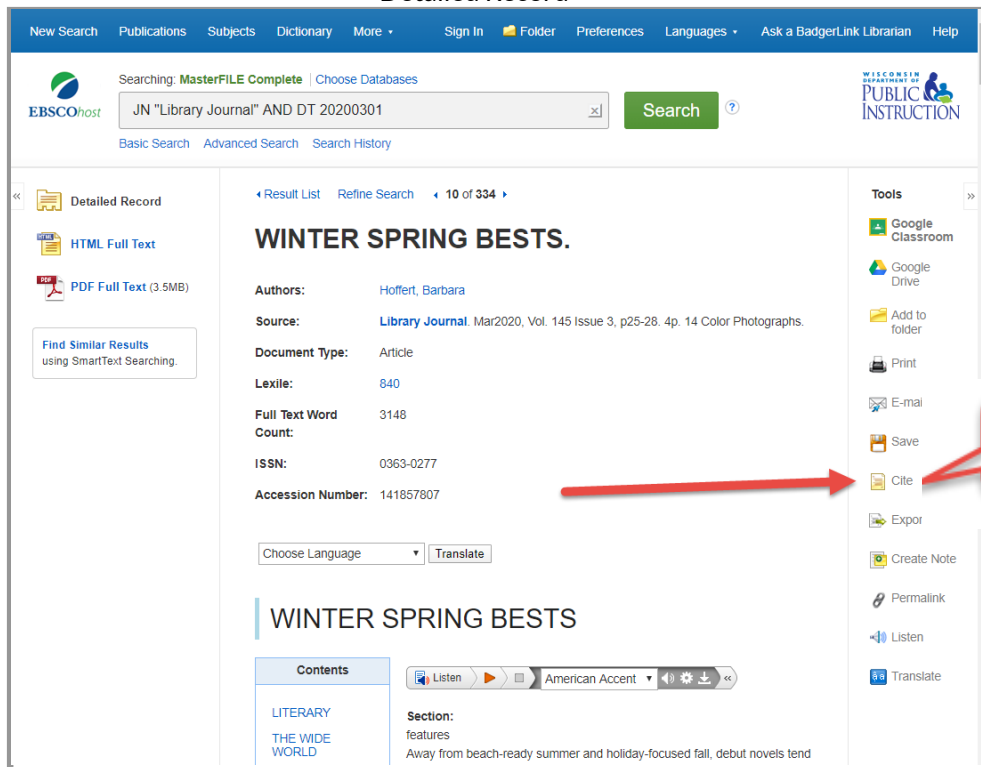
1 Search an EBSCOhost resource.
