

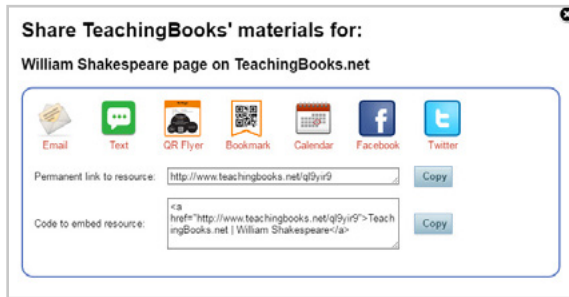

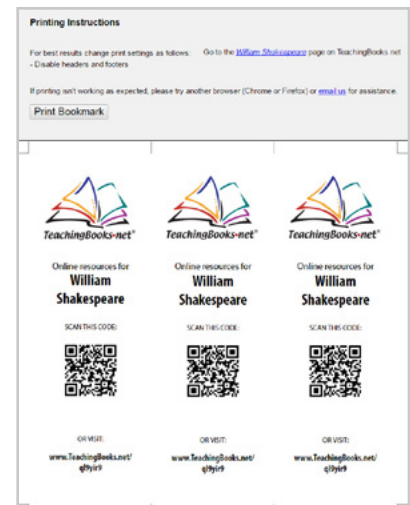


Permalinks
